## Elk's Northeast/Central Regional **Hoop Shoot Results**

The Northeast/Central Regional Hoop Shoot was held on Saturday, March 26, 2011 in Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania. The event was hosted by Wilkes-Barre/Scranton Elks Lodge #109 and was coordinated by NEC Regional Director Frank Bonner. The event was very well organized. The contestants and their family members were treated to a complimentary breakfast at the Ramada Inn the morning of the contest and a send-off award luncheon following the contest.

The NYSEA was represented by our six State champions. When the contest ended, three of shooters achieved Regional championships. They are Riley Tuper in the girls 8-9 division, Jackson Watson in the 8-9 boys division and Grace Thomas in the girls 10-11 division. Jackson Watson made 14 consecutive free throws to force a shootout before achieving his championship by a 5 to 2 score in the shootout. The day's most exciting contest occurred in the boys 10-11 division. Our State champion, Joseph Girard, lost his bid for a regional championship, taking second place honors after losing in 4 shootouts by a score of 20 to 19. Our other State Champions, Ryan Rolland (boys 12-13) and Lilia Cerreta (girls 12-13) each achieved third place honors. Congratulations are extended to our National Regional champions. They will now advance to the National Finals to be held in Springfield, Mass.

Several NYS Elks were in attendance to support our state hoop shooters including Past State Presidents Donald Fisher, Tim Kelly and Richard Wunder. Past State President Fisher served as Master of Ceremonies throughout the Day. The Honorable Carlon O'Malley, Past Grand Exalted Ruler from the State of Pennsylvania was present at the contest and assisted with the award presentations. Past State President Wunder and State Hoop Shoot Director John Edinger presented the awards to our State contestants.

State Hoop Shoot Director John Edinger did an outstanding job in coordinating both our NYS Hoop Shoot contest and in assisting our State champions and their families with travel arrangements for the Regional contest. He and his wife Barb also made arrangements so that each of our Champions was provided a complimentary warm-up suit and state hoop shoot shirt prior to the regional event. Each proudly displayed their warm-up suits during the morning breakfast and during the precontest warm-up.

The 2009 - 2010 fraternal year began promisingly with all seventeen districts of the NYSEA reporting on impressive and moving Flag Day services throughout the Empire State. Of our 127 lodges, 118 reported that they held ceremonies, with 112 of those open to the public. 12, 616 people attended these Flag Day services with 2,680 Elks in their midst. For Flag Day 13,820 Elk miles were covered and 7,922 Elk hours devoted. We can, indeed, all be quite proud of this achievement.

The essay contest this year was entitled "Why I am Proud to be an American" and we received 125 essays from throughout the State of New York. We had the essays judged by two English teachers, one Social Studies teacher and two Past District Deputies Grand Exalted Ruler. The two top winners from each division were sent on for the Grand Lodge Essay Contest.

With Brocks success noted, let me share with you a few other Youth Activity accomplishments since the last convention. During the fall and winter months, children from around the state participated in our Soccer and Hoop Shoot programs. I congratulate Soccer Chair Mike Neaton, Hoop Shoot Chair John Edinger and all our District and Lodge chairs for a job well done in promoting these programs. Our State Soccer Championship was held October 24th and hosted by Oswego Lodge #271. The State Hoop Shoot Contest was held February 26<sup>th</sup>, 2011 and was hosted by Poughkeepsie Lodge #275.
