During a service at Rotterdam Lodge #2157, Richard Durant was presented with the "Outstanding Veteran's Service Award". This is the first award of its kind at Rotterdam Lodge, and the Lodge expects it to become an annual award. Richard has dedicated his entire life to our country. He has 34 years of military service, starting out in the US Navy in 1962 where he served for 2 years, and then moving to the US Army for 4 years. He served 2 tours of duty in Vietnam as a helicopter door gunner. He was awarded 5 purple hearts, the Bronze Start for Valor, the Distinguished Service Cross, and he was nominated twice for the Congressional Medal of Honor. He finished his career in the Air Guard National in Glenville with approximately 20 years of service there, being discharged with the rank of Master Sergeant. But Richard's greatest contribution has been his dedication to the Veterans in our community. Richard spends countless hours helping veterans at the VA Hospital, on the streets, and in the Lodge. For this he is truly an Outstanding Veteran.



Port Jefferson Lodge #2138, under the direction of Chairman Robert McClean and in furtherance of the Elks pledge "So long as there are Veterans we will never forget them", conducted its annual Stickball Tournament in honor of local disabled American veterans from the Iraq/Afghanistan wars. opportunity to hear from Scott King, founder and president of "Remember the Wounded Ride". On Sunday, May 8,2011 ,King departed on his bike from the Gateway Elks Lodge in Portland ,Or. Scott, who is also an Elk, has ridden across the US to raise awareness and funds for our military personnel wounded in Iraq and Afghanistan.

As part of the ride, Scot interviewed combat wounded Veterans and collected their stories for a series of books that will chronicle their experiences. In each state, a combat wounded Veteran of that state was selected to be honored for his/her service and to represent all Veterans of that state. At each state capital, Scot has requested a state flag from the governor's office. These flags will be brought back to Portland, OR where they will be presented in the Veterans Memorial Coliseum during a special ceremony at the end of the ride. Each flag will represent the combat wounded veterans of its respective state and their service to our country.

This years ride ended in October 2001 in Washington DC with over 7,000 miles accumulated. The trek resumes in May of 2012 with another 12,000 miles expected to be covered Convention goers donated over \$1,700 dollars to "Remember the Wounded Ride".
