Lancaster Lodge #1478 held their twelfth annual Trench Trophy Award Banquet and Hall of Fame Induction on Tuesday, December 2. The award recognizes the best high school football lineman in Western New York and encompasses over 70 schools and almost a 1,000 eligible players. The ten inductees were honored in front of a crowd of over 250 people including Lodge members, coaches, players, local and national dignitaries, and media. Guest speakers included Jim McNally, a famed NFL Offensive Line Coach, and Joe DeLamielleure, a member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame. Each inductee receives a trophy and their name is added to the Hall of Fame, while one winner, deemed to be the Lineman of the Year, receives a \$1,000 college scholarship. This year's winner was Joe Mistretta from Jamestown. A 6'2, 290 pound offensive and defensive lineman, who helped lead his team to a State Championship, plans to attend Edinboro or Syracuse University. The award, started in 2003 by members Carl Kuras and Len Kuhn, has become a highly publicized youth program for the Lodge. Local media including television, print, and radio cover the award on a weekly basis throughout the year with the crescendo at the annual banquet. Multiple Hall of Fame Inductees have gone on to play in the National Football League and colleges now utilize the award as a scouting tool for potential recruits.
