While at the Elks National Convention, all of New York's delegates had the pleasure of meeting our National Scholarship winner Sarah Jiudice, sponsored from Southampton Lodge #1574. - C.P. of Ulster County, to assist in the construction of an ADA compliant sidewalk
- Able2 is embarking on the first step toward a community garden, and Upstate Cerebral Palsy's grant will help make an equine-assisted therapy center a reality.

Our Public Relations Chairman Michael Jones, along with the *Empire State Elk* publication Chairman Tim Welpe did a terrific job with our insert in the Albany Times Union paper that was published on September 18<sup>th</sup>.
